RFP ADDENDUM #1
Disaster-Related Debris Removal Monitoring Services
Scope of Work

1. The Contractor(s) may be responsible for clearing non-navigable waterways of storm debris, as directed by the City in writing. This may include emergency response to clear blockages and other impediments to water flow that pose an immediate flood risk to improved property. Once water flow paths are restored, the City will determine if further debris removal in designated areas is necessary (i.e. in canals, streams, lakes, etc.). Marine debris removal from non-navigable waterways may include the removal and disposal of trees, branches, brush, and other debris deposited in and adjacent to the waterway. All associated pricing for this work should be included in the proposal as necessary.
2. The selected Contractor(s) must be very knowledgeable and have a strong understanding of FEMA's Public Assistance Program and Policy Guide (PAPPG).
